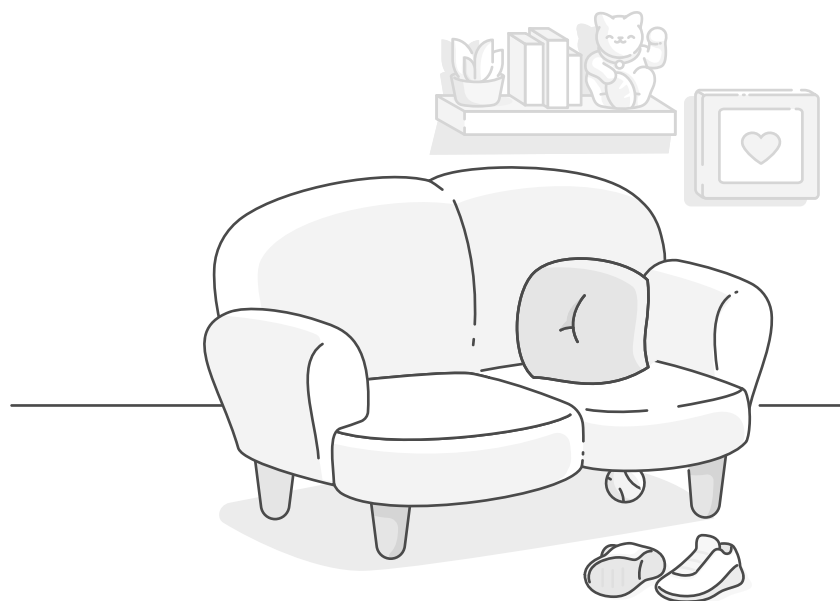


Packing Checklist

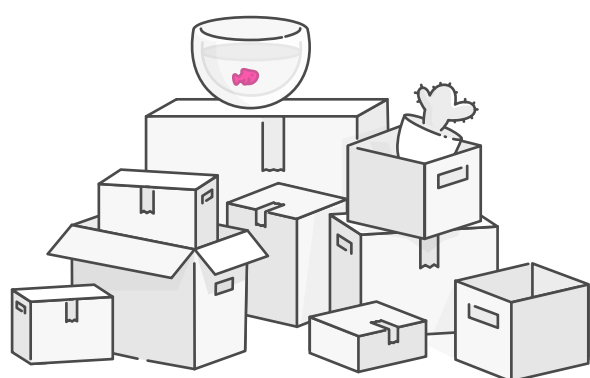


Bedroom

- Pack personal items like keepsakes and jewelry first
- Use vacuum-sealed bags for out-of-season clothes
- Keep clothes on hangers in wardrobe boxes or garment bags
- Use suitcases for dresser items
- Pack shoes in original boxes or keep them together in one
- Protect your mattress with a mattress bag or heavy plastic
- Disassemble large furniture and label small parts
- Pack daily essentials last

Kitchen

- Pack kitchen later
- Pack less frequently used items first, such as:
 - Cookware (e.g., pots, pans)
 - Baking dishes
 - Specialty appliances (e.g., stand mixers, slow cookers)
 - Extra utensils and kitchen tools
- Stack plates vertically, wrapping each one
- Use special boxes for fragile items—like dishes and glasses
- Group silverware and gadgets in labeled boxes
- Dispose of perishables and open packages
- Try to eat some perishable food to minimize waste
- Remove detachable parts from appliances and pack them securely
- Combine small miscellaneous items into labeled boxes



Living Room

- Take photos of setups pre-tear down
- Box small items first—like books and electronics
- Remove light bulbs and lampshades, storing them separately
- Label cords and batteries for electronics and remotes
- Wrap electronics, mirrors, and glass decor in blankets or towels
- Disassemble large furniture and label parts
- Roll up and secure rugs
- Use separate boxes for fragile items like vases and glassware

Office

- Pack books and documents in small boxes
- Keep important documents in a labeled, secure box
- Wrap electronics in bubble wrap and label wires
- Disassemble and pack office furniture; keep small parts together and labeled
- Store small office supplies like pens and pencils in ziplock bags
- Wrap fragile items—like photo frames—in bubble wrap

Bathroom

- Pack toiletries in clear bags
- Wrap fragile items in towels or linens
- Keep medications and first-aid supplies separate and handy
- Use leak-proof bags for liquids
- Prepare a small box with essential bathroom items
